Sorting, classifying, making order and pattern. This practical workshop explores the way children make sense of the real chaotic world through their own and others' collections. Delegates will be introduced to the big ideas and what matters to children when they explore the world through collections.

Q is for questions

This reflective workshop explores the questions of children. Workshop participants will think about the different kinds of questions educators use and the effect these have on children's thinking, explore ways of using questions more effectively, consider ways of using children's questions as starting points for learning, be introduced to ways of encouraging, recording and valuing children's questions as well as consider the importance of establishing a culture where asking questions comes naturally to children.
